## AUTHORITY IN RELIGION

A chain of command is noted in the scriptures. One must first of all acknowledge that the Bible is in some manner inspired or that the Bible is true before the following logic is valid. To study with one that does not believe in the Christian faith will require study from different ground rules. Other apologetics must be utilized.

I. God by definition is in control and is ultimate authority.
